6. Public Reports | Presentations

2022 - 019 Proclamation - Public Safety Appreciation Week

Mayor Thurman read and presented the proclamation to the Powder Springs Law Enforcement Officers and Public Safety Personnel that provides safety to the community and properties.

Chief Lane Cadwell mentioned the Cobb County's Annual Public Safety Awards breakfast was held this morning and Captain Jason Holcomb was awarded the Medal of Valor, which is a very prestigious honor.

2022 -020 Proclamation – Hispanic Heritage Month

Mayor Pro Tem Lust presented and read the proclamation recognizing the achievements of the Hispanic Community to be held annually September 15th-October 15th.

<u>2022 -021</u> Proclamation - Emergency Preparedness

Council Member Bordelon presented and read the proclamation to raise awareness and the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies at anytime.

RPT 22-108 City Manager Report - Projects

Pam Conner, City Manager, provided updates on parking plans with the .02 of an acre of land at the downtown cemetery. She also discussed the open land west of the Primitive Baptist Church, which is in the public right of way, for possible preservation of the structure and additional parking. Mrs. Conner presented the history of the Austell Powder Springs Trail Study and the roundabout recommendations at Austell Powder Springs Road and Marietta Street.

Tina Garver, Community Development Director, added that Georgia Tech, with the assistance of the Atlanta Regional Commission, conducted a Powder Springs Corridor Connectivity Study focusing on Powder Springs and Austell Powder Springs Roads. The roundabout is a result of that study.

Eric Meyer, Development and Infrastructure Agency Director, stated that the Cobb County Trail Master Plan was adopted in 2018. It included looking at trail connections from the Silver Comet to Downtown Austell.

- 2. Approval of the special use request to allow a fence in the front yard. Any fencing structures installed in the front yard shall comply with the approved material composition and types specified for residential zoning districts in Table 4-1 of the Unified Development Code. Fencing around the front yard shall not exceed 5-feet in height.
- 3. The installation of the front yard shall be subject to design review and approval by the Community Development Department, for composition materials and fence type.
- 4. Approval of the variance to increase the maximum allowed height of a front yard gate from 3-feet to 7-feet.
- 5. Should the gate be substantially damaged and need considerable repairs, it shall not be replaced.
