

## RESOLUTION 2021-069

### **A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REPLACEMENT OF POLICE VEHICLE LAPTOPS FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$91,500; ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

**WHEREAS**, as a tool necessary to perform the responsibilities of sworn public safety personnel, laptops are installed in each officer's vehicle;


**WHEREAS**, existing laptops are approaching end of useful life with resulting failures and expensive temporary repairs;


**WHEREAS**, laptop replacement is expected to take longer than usual due to inventory shortages, and the information technology provider for the City of Powder Springs, VC3, has recommended taking steps to secure the needed laptops to ensure their availability at the outset of the new fiscal year;

**WHEREAS**, VC3 recommends Dell Latitude 5420 Rugged laptops, including a 3-year warranty, accidental damage, and 16GM of RAM, and the City of Powder Springs desires to accept and approve this recommendation;


**BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED** by the Council for the City of Powder Springs that it accepts and approves the recommendation of VC3 to replace existing police vehicle laptops and directs the City Manager to take steps to secure, configure and deploy 36 said laptops for an amount not to exceed \$91,500. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon approval.
