A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF POWDER SPRINGS ("CITY") TO ENTER INTO INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENTS WITH COBB COUNTY, GEORGIA FOR ANIMAL CONTROL SERVICES, FIRE MARSHALL SPACE, COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT, AND TRAFFIC SIGNAL MAINTENANCE; GRANTING THE MAYOR AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE ALL NECESSARY DOCUMENTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Powder Springs ("City") is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Georgia, and is charged with providing public services to its residents;

WHEREAS, Article IX, Section II, Paragraph III of the State Constitution authorizes the expenditure of public funds by counties and municipal corporations for services, programs and facilities;

WHEREAS, Article IX, Section III, Paragraph I of the State Constitution (the "Intergovernmental Contracts Clause") authorizes intergovernmental contracts between any ". . . county, municipality, school district or political subdivision of the state . . . with each other or any other public agency, public corporation, or public authority for joint services, for the provision of services or for joint or separate use of facilities or equipment. . ."; and

WHEREAS, the City and Cobb County, Georgia ("County") desire to enter into certain intergovernmental agreements related to (i) animal control services, (ii) providing space for the Fire Marshall in the City, (iii) for cooperative purchasing agreement, and (iv) to provide for traffic signal maintenance;

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council in the exercise of their sound judgment and discretion, after giving thorough thought to all implications involved, and keeping in mind the public interest and welfare of the citizens of the City, have determined it to be in the best interest of the citizens of the City, that this Resolution be adopted.

THEREFORE, IT IS NOW RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POWDER SPRINGS that it approves authorizes the Mayor to execute any and all intergovernmental agreements and documents which may be necessary or convenient to effectuate this Resolution in substantially similar format as the agreements attached hereto and incorporated by reference, subject to the approval of the City attorney.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that to the extent any portion of this Resolution is declared to be invalid, unenforceable, or nonbinding, that shall not affect the remaining portions of this Resolution, and that all resolutions are hereby repealed to the extent they are inconsistent with the Resolution.
