Tina Garver, Community Development Director, discussed the special use renewal application. Mrs. Garver added that Staff recommends approval or the used merchandise store and the Virtual Reality (VR) gaming business, but Staff recommends denial of the food truck park based on a number of code violations.

Eugene Idlett, Special Use Applicant, discussed applying for the special use of the food truck as a whole and addressed the code enforcement actions, stating he no problem complying - just needed more time to financially be able to meet compliance.

Octavia Weems, resident of 4866 Country Cove Way in Powder Springs GA, spoke in favor of the food truck park for family entertainment.

Dyon Holmes, VR gaming business owner, spoke in favor of the food truck park for the community and stated his business was bringing people to the City for private events.
