

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-055

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING COMPLETION AND SUBMITTAL OF ANNUAL SUBRECIPIENT APPLICATIONS TO THE COBB COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM OFFICE FOR THE USE OF CDBG FUNDS TO INSTALL IMPROVEMENTS AT THE SILVER COMET TRAIL LINEAR PARK AND SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER FACILITY FOR PROGRAM YEARS 2018 AND 2019; AMENDING THE 2018 SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT TO INSTALL SHADE STRUCTURES ADJACENT TO THE PLAYGROUND AT THE LINEAR PARK AND OFFSET CERTAIN YOUTH CAMP SERVICE EXPENSES; AUTHORIZING THE 2019 SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT TO INCLUDE HEALTH AND FITNESS EQUIPMENT, GARDEN STRUCTURES AND STRUCTURAL IMPROVEMENTS AT THE SENIOR CITIZENS FACILITY; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE CDBG DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE SAME; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Cobb County receives Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 to carry out various community development activities in unincorporated areas and in municipalities participating in the CDBG program, including the City of Powder Springs (the "City");

WHEREAS, the City receives an annual fair share amount from the CDBG program and desires to submit an application to utilize its Program Year 2018 allocation to complete certain public park improvements for playground shade structures at the City's Silver Comet Trail Linear Park and to offset certain youth camp service expenses and its Program Year 2019 allocation to complete certain health, fitness, gardening and structural improvements at the Senior Citizens Center facility;


BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Council for the City of Powder Springs that the City staff is authorized to submit the Program Year 2018 and 2019 Subrecipient applications to use the City's fair share allocation to complete improvements at the Silver Comet Trail Linear park for shade structures, youth camp service expenses and Senior Citizens Center facility for health and fitness equipment, gardening structures and structural improvements, and the Mayor is authorized to execute agreements or amendments to effectuate same after review and approval by the City Attorney.
