### Call to Order

### **Mayor's Comments**

Mayor Al Thurman shared that he attended the Cities United Summit and discussed the Conflict Resolution class; and also attended the Cobb Chamber Gala.

Economic Development Director Marsellas Williams facilitated the work session.

RPT 24-005 Report presented by Pam C. - Update on legislative and lobbying issues

Pam Conner, City Manager, provided an update on the arranged meeting between the Mayor and the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) Commissioner to discuss the 278 curb cut issues.

The Council body asked would the State Commissioner have the final say or recommend another recourse. Mrs. Conner answered that the Commissioner would be able to vary or to waive the State rules but it may come at a cost at the Federal level.

L. Tre Hutchins, Cobb County School Post 3 Board Member, discussed renovation funding for schools, demography study report, advance placement school recognitions, school district mapping, and the education appreciation day.

The Council body asked what would the impact be should McEachern High School no longer be under the Powder Springs mapping jurisdiction; why isn't Powder Springs Elementary a school of choice; are Compton and Powder Springs Elementary Schools up to capacity; and will the under capacity schools close. Mr. Hutchins answered the impact would revert back to a two person board member; there are a number of reasons why Powder Springs Elementary is not considered a school of choice; neither Compton nor Powder Springs Elementary Schools are at full capacity; and currently there is no conversation by the Board of Education to close or consolidate schools.

Wayne Wright, Interim Development and Infrastructure Agency Executive Director, introduced contractors funded through American Rescue Plan (ARPA) to report on the grocery store in Tapp Middle School and tutoring services.

Mitchell Tanzi, of GoodR, provided a report on the shopping process, the number of families serviced and size, students that are eligible for free or reduced priced lunch, and the economic value to the students and families.

The Council body asked are the students going to the GoodR grocery store to get their lunch or going to the cafeteria. Mr. Tanzi replied that the students are going to the cafeteria to get their lunch.

Natalie Rutledge, Executive Director of Communities In Schools, reported on the tutoring services, student results, and attendance in Powder Springs Elementary.

The Council body asked how many students at Powder Springs Elementary are in the program; do the students leave the program and return; and are the tutors one to one or one to group. Ms. Rutledge answered 75 students have been supported currently;

the program does cycle students out should they improve and go back to the classes; and some are one to one and some are one to small group.

Tina Garver, Community Develoment Director, discussed the rezoning application from Cobb County general commercial to Powder Springs neighborhood retail commercial.

Staff and Planning and Zoning Commission recommends approval of the application.

Joel Larkin, of Sams Larkin Huff, LLP, discussed that proposal to open a package store and the applicant is currently looking for tenants to build out future retail pads.
