

RESOLUTION 2018-133

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND RATIFYING THE EMERGENCY PURCHASE OF A COMPUTER SERVER FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENTS FROM VC3, INC. AT A TOTAL COST OF \$15,425.02; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Powder Springs (the "City") Police Department has physical host server purchased by the City in June 2010, which hosts two Virtual Machines; the Police Department Domain controller and file server, which is used to authenticate logins for the police domain and store the Police Department specific file shares and the VPN Server, which hosts the Columbiatech VPN software, allowing officers to access the Police Department network remotely; and

WHEREAS, both servers are critical for the daily functions of the Police Department; and

WHEREAS, city has a longstanding relationship with VC3, Inc. to assist with the City's information technology needs; and

WHEREAS, the typical lifespan of a production server is 3-5 years, and the server currently in use is beginning to exhibit signs of hardware failure, resulting in an immediate and emergency need for a replacement, which has already been ordered from VC3, Inc. at a cost of \$15,425.02; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council find such expenditure to be necessary, appropriate, and in the best interest of the public.

NOW THEREFORE, be it hereby resolved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Powder Springs that the necessary emergency purchase of a new host server for the Police Department at a total cost of \$15,425.02 from VC3, Inc. is hereby approved and ratified. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.


